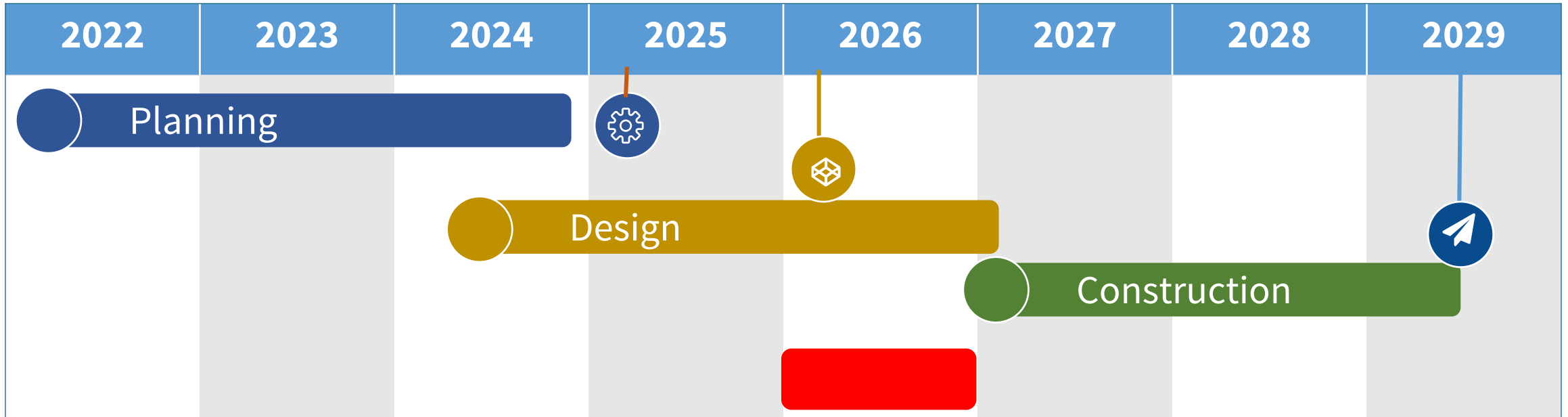

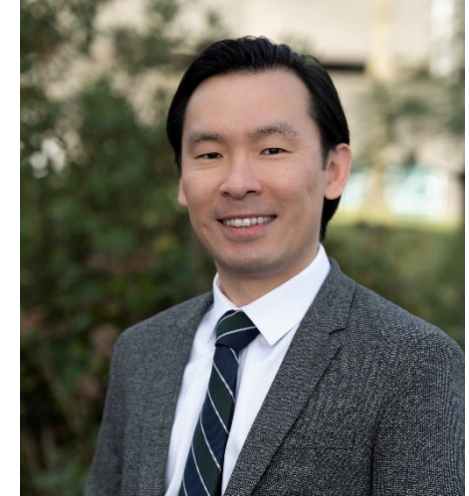
Katie Nelson – Project Manager
