TriMet Updates:

- Rosa Parks Day (Also referred to nationally as Transit Equity Day). No fare collected all day February 4
- New Hop card machine rollout in progress
- Type 6 MAX trains on the system
- Community Engagement outreach events recap

Relationship Building & Partner Updates:

Partners shared collaborative advocacy for the transportation package, supportive events around Rosa Parks Day (Transit Equity Day), and community-driven projects like sharing spaces to engage the community, free e-bike ride-to-own programs, fare programs registration, and Oregon Active Transportation Summit, which will be April 23-25. PBOT is also seeking Transportation System Plan Community Advisory Committee members.

FX Update: 82nd Avenue Transit Project

We acknowledge this is the most traveled corridor in the region. The Community Advisory Committee has begun meeting. TEAC partners asked for clarification on 1/3 miles stop spacing to the number of blocks, expressed interest in having symbols at the stops and stations for mobility devices to board, and want exploration of more color and tactile products for cane detection for front doors for those who are visually impaired. Partners acknowledge they are excited and will be monitoring this project closely as this may serve as a model for TV Highway.

TriMet's Commitment to Safety, Inclusivity, Equity, Community, and Teamwork:

Focusing on what matters amid uncertainty and change. General Manager Sam Desue Jr. has said "At times like these, it's important to focus on what we do know and what we can control.
